- In April the council was invited to attend a joint volunteerism seminar in Eugene with members of the Eugene-Springfield member leadership. As a result, various leadership training materials are being developed by our Strategic Planning committee to assist current and future leadership in the OLLI-UO program sites.
- The Strategic Planning committee has developed three major goals to implement over the next several years: A focus on training and development for current and future leadership; a membership plan for member retention and outreach to new members; and a facilities plan for the time in the future when a larger facility becomes available and is affordable. This to a great extent depends not only on growth of OLLI-UO programming, but also on the programmatic growth of the academic stakeholders partnering locally with UO Academic Extension.
- The Council has decided to manage member growth during the new fiscal year to a "stable state" of 152 members, the count that existed at the end of the 2014-15 Fiscal Year. This means that our outreach efforts for the coming year will be directed to balance the projected natural attrition of membership, while factoring in our continuing efforts to retain current members. To this end, the annual "Experience OLLI" outreach event will be scheduled for October, and additional recruitment events will only be

- scheduled if needed to achieve the "stable state."
- A number of policy and procedural issues have been discussed and will be implemented by the fall. They are: preregistration for highdemand/high attendance classes, scheduling all-member events to minimize conflict with major religious holy days, implementing electronic balloting for council member elections, recruitment and selection procedures for new council candidates, and clarification of member complaint communication procedures, to name a few.
- Many of you have weighed in on some of these policies and procedures already, and I encourage and solicit all members to become familiar with them and provide Council with your input. Approved minutes of the council's past deliberations are on file in the work room and can be accessed to read by contacting Heather Inghram at the UO Bend Center front office. Hopefully, they will be available on line in the near future.
- The Program, Membership, and Hospitality committees have been working hard to provide another great year for our Central Oregon members, and will be communicating with you in a number of ways in the near future.
- Finally, as we wind down our summer activities, be aware that volunteerism is the core of our existence. You've heard this before, but we need to refresh the
